Introduction

Welcome to the Junior Golf Academy at Radley Run! The Academy is for ages 5-18 and runs from mid-June to mid-August. The **Junior Golf program** for ages 8-18 is an organized playing and instructional program that stresses golf technique, course management, rules of golf, and course etiquette for all skill levels. Now a part of the Junior Golf Academy, **Tiger Cubs - Summer Golf** is an instruction based program for ages 5 to 7. Tiger Cubs instruction with the Pros is held on Tuesday morning while the older golfers are out on the course.

Handicaps

18 hole handicaps are available to all junior golfers free of charge. Each participant in the Junior Golf Academy will have a handicap number and is able to enter their scores.

Certification

Certification allows the Junior Golfer to play without the accompaniment of an adult. A certified Junior Golfer will display a "Certified Junior Golfer" tag on their bag. Only 9 and 18 Hole *Golf Members* are eligible to be certified when they become 12 years old. Five Holes cannot be certified, and juniors who are not certified must always be accompanied by an adult on the golf course and the range. There is a written test and 9-hole playing timed test. Please see the Pro Shop to schedule your certification time.

Eligibility and Fees

The children of Golf Members (ages 5 to 18), the grandchildren of Golf Members and the children of Sports Members, and the children of Pool and Social Members are all eligible to join the Junior Golf Academy.

After registering for the program, the appropriate membership classification will be billed to your account.

Rates for the 2019 summer-long Golf Academy are as per the table below based on membership category and registration date.

Your child receives:

- Tiger Cubs instruction *OR* Weekly Play-day on Tuesday
- Instruction from the pros at scheduled times
- Skills testing and an End-of-Season organized Skills Challenge & BBQ
- Tournament entry fees for: the Opening Scramble, Adult Junior Scramble and the Parent/Child Closing Tournament; and lunch for the Adult Junior Scramble Tournament
- Junior Academy Club Championship - two day stroke play
- Trophies, Awards and Gifts (distributed at the Awards Banquet).

Summer Programs and Schedule

The Radley Run Junior Golf Academy offers a summer-long **Tiger Cubs and Junior Golf Program**.

Tiger Cubs for ages 5 to 7 is an instructional program and is a part of the Junior Golf Academy. Tiger Cubs will meet on Tuesday mornings from 10:15 to 11:00 during the Junior Golf Academy play day.

Junior Golf Program for ages 8 to 18 runs from June 18 to August 25. Tuesdays will be *Course Play Days*. All juniors will have a specific tee time each Tuesday, but **MUST sign-up to play by NOON Sunday**.

To sign-up visit the Radley Run CC website - Member Central, Calendar, select Junior Golf Events, select either tournaments or Tuesday play day, sign up through golf Genius or email JRGolf@RadleyRunCC.com by **Sunday at noon to sign up**.

The 5 Holers will tee off starting at 7:30. The 9 & 18 Holers will tee off starting at 8:00. Tee times will vary week to week depending on participation.

The tee times will be released on Sunday after 5:00 pm.

Your clinic time will be the SAME all season, either Wednesday OR Thursday for 5, 9 & 18 holers. Please call the pro shop in the case of inclement weather during scheduled clinic time. Sign-up for clinics in the pro shop. The sign up will be available beginning on April 17th.

Season Opening Adult-Child Tournament

Get your group together to kick off the start of another great year of Junior Golf! This event is a 9-hole foursome scramble with any combination of juniors and adults. Event fee is included with the Jr. Golf Academy fee. Register by signing up in the pro shop or email JRGolf@RadleyRunCC.com. Please include Juniors Name, hole division, guests name, and guests handicap. The sign up deadline will be June 1st at noon. **Carts for this event will be billed to participants.**

Junior Academy Club Championship

Two Day Event

Monday, July 8 & Tuesday, July 9

This championship is open to ALL Junior Golf Academy participants as well as all juniors that **Golf Members** of Radley Run. **There will be a \$25.00 tournament entry fee if not enrolled in the Junior Golf Academy.** Register in the Pro Shop or email JRGolf@RadleyRunCC.com. Please sign up by Friday, July 5th at noon. Parents of participants must monitor/ marshal one time per child. If a parent is unable to fulfill their commitment, it is their responsibility to provide a suitable substitute. A suitable substitute is at least 16 years old with general golf knowledge. Spectators must check in with coordinators and the Pro Shop.

Important Information:

- Monitors and marshals must not advise or coach in any way. This may result in disqualification of the players.
- Spectators are welcome, however, they must not interact with the players.
- All players must carry their own bag; no caddies. All players must walk.
- No mulligans. No “gimmies”. A whiff counts as a stroke.
- All scorecards must be signed and attested.
- Eight and four stroke rule applies to all 5, 9 & 18 holers If a player has taken 8 strokes and not reached the green, they place the ball on the nearest edge of the green from their line of play. There is a 4-putt limit once the ball is on the green.
- Any actions, ie., vulgar language, swearing, throwing, or banging clubs will result in 1st offense warning; 2nd offense will be disqualification.
- Ties for winner will be played off sudden death from hole #1.
- All 9 holers and 18 hole girls will use the red tees. 18 hole boys will use the white tees. 5-holers will tee off from specified areas on each hole.

Winners and runner-ups of the club championship at the 5 and 9 hole level earn the right to play up a category the next golf season if they so choose.

Note: Participants must be available for all scheduled rounds and compete in the category he/she played in all season unless they decide to play up. All rounds of the tournament are monitored.

Annual Adult Junior Scramble for Boys and Girls

Tuesday, August 6

Sign-up on the RRCC website calendar or email JRGolf@RadleyRunCC.com. The sign up deadline will be Sunday, August 4 at noon. **Carts for this event will be billed to participants.**

Junior girls are paired with 9 and 18 hole women together in teams for this fun 9 hole scramble event. It is open to all junior girls, 5, 9 and 18 holers. Prizes are awarded. Event fee is included with the Jr. Golf Academy fee.

Junior boys are paired together with Adult Men in teams for this fun 9-hole scramble event. It is open to all junior boys, 5, 9 and 18 holers. Prizes are awarded. Event fee is included with the Jr. Golf Academy fee.

The girls scramble was first played in 1989 and was originally named for Carole Eason and Carole Griffith, who gave so much of themselves to our Junior Golf Program. The boys 9-hole scramble began in 1993.

Closing Adult-Child Tournament

Sunday, August 25

This is the traditional way to end our junior golf season. Juniors may invite any adult (parent, member and even non-members) to play a 9-hole selective drive, alternate shot tournament. Event fee is included with the Jr. Golf Academy program. Sign-up online on the club Calendar or email JRGolf@RadleyRunCC.com. **Carts for this event will be billed to participants. There will be a \$50.00 tournament entry fee if not enrolled in the Junior Golf Academy.**

Awards Banquet

Sunday, August 25

The awards banquet will begin at 6:00 p.m. for junior golfers and their family members/friends. The dinner is by reservation only – you must give the exact number in your party. Make your reservation with Kim Jones in the club office at 610-793-1660. The awards ceremony will follow immediately after the dinner buffet. Prizes, awards, as well as the Closing Adult –Child Tournament winners will be presented at that time.



AWARDS

Most Improved Player Award

This award will be presented to one boy and one girl from each category who has improved the most, based on scores from the beginning of the season to the end.

CARE Award

This award is to acknowledge golfers who exhibit an understanding of the CARE program of Course Appreciation, Rules, and Etiquette. This includes a positive attitude, fairness, enthusiasm for the sport and who participate regularly on junior play days. At the Closing Awards banquet juniors from each classification will be recognized. Marshals and Monitors are the primary source for this information. We encourage them to pass along this type of positive behavior to the Coordinators.

The CARE program has been developed at Radley in order to offer a well-defined and structured set of guidelines for learning and understanding the game of golf. The CARE program concentrates on the part of the game that is outside the skill aspect of golf, which is reserved for the instructional golf clinics taught by the club's professional.



COURSE APPEARANCE

- **Greens Play**—The green is a delicate, growing and important area of the course. Golf bags should be placed well off the green and the flagstick placed gently out of the way. Check the green for ball marks and repair them.
- **Divots**—**REPLACE ALL DIVOTS.** This applies to all areas of the course including the fairway and especially the teeing ground. If using the seed/sand mix, pour and smooth in empty divot.
- **Bunkers**— When your ball enters a bunker, locate the closest rake and carry it with you to the area. Always enter the bunker in the flattest area. After the shot, carefully rake out sand bunker. After finishing raking, lay the rake on the outside of the bunker.
- **Ball Mark Repairs on Greens**—If your shot to the green leaves a ball mark, find that mark immediately upon arriving to the green and repair it before going to your ball. To fix the ball mark use your repair tool or a tee. Go around the edges of the ball mark and gently lift inward. Then use your putter to gently tap down on the ball mark, making it even with the putting surface.

Monitors and Marshals

The Junior Golf Academy can only succeed with the cooperation of all the junior golf parents. Marshals and monitors are an important and necessary part of the Junior Golf Academy. Parents and guardians must realize that along with their child's participation in the program comes an **obligation to monitor or marshal during the season**. Monitor/Marshal must be at least 16 years of age and have some golf knowledge.

5-Hole Monitors: A parent must monitor two times per child.

Monitor duties:

- Arrive 15 minutes prior to your assigned tee time
- Walk with the 5 Holvers and keep score (4 and 8 rule– see Pace of Play)
- Keep the pace of play moving
- Stress golf etiquette
- A ball hit in the water - count the stroke and penalty, drop on green side of hazard and continue play

9 & 18 Hole Cart Marshals:

Radley Run's Junior Golf Program is dedicated to "Coaching the Game". We would like to extend that same commitment to the Marshal program and invite parents who are golfers to sign up for multiple dates as Marshals. This role is an interactive one with the juniors as the fundamentals of CARE are communicated to the players, while they are playing. Cart Marshals need to sign up for one date minimum per child in the 9 or 18 hole program. Marshals need to stay on course until all players complete play. Although golf carts are utilized by marshals, it is encouraged to interact with the juniors as much as possible. This is best done at the tee box and the greens. Marshals are encouraged to do the following:

- Introduce themselves to all players
- Help groups maintain a good pace of play
- Assist with attending the flag stick on the greens
- Instruct on key etiquette rules
- Instruct on key course care rules such as repairing ball marks on greens & fairway divot replacement
- Offer words of encouragement

Utilizing these basic techniques of marshaling will not only make it more enjoyable for the juniors, but will also make the marshals' time on the course more purposeful and enjoyable.

Monitor/Marshal Schedules:

Requested dates are given on a first come, first serve basis as received. Final schedules will be available June 16. The schedule will be emailed to everyone. Please be sure to check the entire schedule for your assigned dates. If you will be unavailable on a date assigned, you must find a substitute Cart Marshal or Monitor. All monitors and marshals must sign in at the junior golf table 15 minutes prior to their scheduled time. Marshals are asked to read the CARE Training section of this booklet before marshaling. The Pro shop will have a limited number of substitutes for "hire". The parent will be given contact information and must coordinate with the substitute. The cost is \$40 per substitute.

Pace of Play

- For 5 hole and 9 hole beginners, the person putting should continue to putt until the ball is in the hole.
- All juniors will have an 8-stroke limit on the fairway with an additional stroke limit of 4 on the green. Maximum stroke limit is 12 per hole. After taking 8 strokes, a player should pick up their ball and place it on the edge of the green and add the number of putts to their eight strokes. The only time this rule is not used is during special events.
- "READY GOLF" requires each player to continually prepare for the next shot.

Monitors and Marshals will be stressing this procedure each week. Faster groups should be given the courtesy of precedence on the course.

Dress Code

Golf slacks, shirts tailored for golf with or without collars and golf shorts (no shorter than the width of the scorecard above the knee) are accepted. It is recommended to wear shirts with collars. Shirt tails will be tucked at all times. Caps, hats and visors will be worn with the bill or obvious front of the hat facing forward.

Prohibited items and apparel include metal golf spikes, tank tops, tee shirts, shorts tailored for other than golf, cargo pants, fatigues and sweats. Anyone attired in such a manner will not be permitted to play or practice.

Discipline Policy

A discipline policy is in effect to protect the safety of junior golfers and to preserve the integrity of the game. Inappropriate behavior, vulgar language, and abuse of golf course/ clubs are not acceptable. A warning will be given, followed by a phone call home. Repeated offenses will result in removing the child from the course and/ or not allowing the child to participate the following week.

Severe Weather

Junior golf will be held if it is raining but will be called off in the event of severe weather such as thunder or lightning. The Golf Course Superintendent makes the final decision as to play the morning of the event. Do not call the coordinators. They will not know if play is canceled until they come to the club. In the event of thunder or lightning, the lightening detection system will sound an alarm and children must leave the course and parents need to pick up their children at the club or make arrangements to have their children picked up.

Chester County Junior Interclub

9 and 18 hole certified junior golfers who have a minimum of one year experience in the junior golf program may participate in Chester County Days by registering and paying a fee of \$25.00. *If the junior golfer is NOT enrolled in the Junior Golf Academy the fee for Chester County Days will increase to \$50.00*

Group Divisions:

Junior Junior: 8 - 11yrs, boys & girls play 9 holes from red tees

Intermediate: 12 - 14yrs, boys & girls play 18 holes from red tees

Junior: 15 - 18yrs, boys play 18 holes from white tees, girls play 18 holes from red tees

9 Hole Intermediate: 12-14 years of age. Boys and Girls 9 Holes from Red Tees.

Chester County Days also includes team play in that the club earning the most points wins a plaque at the end of the season

Play is conducted on seven scheduled dates at different area courses. One week prior to each of these dates, *the junior or parent of Junior* desiring to play on that date may sign up with the Radley Run Junior Golf Coordinator, Ryan Smith via email at JrGolf@RadleyRunCC.com. When signing up please provide the juniors name, age, and group division. In the event there are not enough certified golfers signed up, a non-certified golfer in good standing with junior golf, who receives approval from head pro, may sign up as a substitute. Tee times will be assigned and players are responsible for finding out their tee time from the chairperson or the Golf Pro Shop. Tee times will be sent to the email address provided at sign up 2 days before the Chester county day event. Tee time requests can not be accommodated.

The first 20 juniors to sign up, 10 – 9 holers and 10 – 18 holers, will be eligible to play each Chester County Day with the exception of the home date at Radley Run. All certified juniors may participate at the home Chester County Day on August 1. Five alternate players in each category may sign up and will be called to play in 1 thru 5 numerical order should there be a cancellation notice the day before the match.

The Chester County Day Coordinator (by Email) and Host Club (by Phone) must be notified by 5:00 p.m. the afternoon before the Chester County match of a cancellation so that an alternate player can be notified on a timely basis. A junior who fails to show up for play at Chester County without canceling the afternoon before will not be eligible to play in the next Chester County event.

During Radley Run's Host Day for Chester County Days, parents must monitor/marshal one time per child, or send an acceptable substitute. Failure to do so will result in their child being unable to play in the next Chester County Day event and/or regularly scheduled junior golf day.

An acceptable substitute monitor / marshal is responsible and at least 16 years of age and have some general golf knowledge. Awards are given at the end of the season for the best individual and team scores. The decision to play, due to weather conditions, is made by the Host Club the morning of the event.

Area Club Directions

Chester Valley Golf Club – Take 202 North to Route 30 east. Turn left on Church Road. Turn left at the stop sign onto Swedesford Road. Club parking lot is on the right.

Or

Traveling north on Rt. 202, exit at Rt. 401 north. Stay left and make left at end of off ramp and continue to stay in the left lane. At the first light, turn left onto Church Road, follow Church Road for ½ mile to first stop sign. Make a right. Clubhouse is straight ahead.

Coatesville Country Club – Take Rt. 30 West Bypass to the “Airport” exit (2nd exit past the V.A. Hospital). Take a left off the exit ramp to Rt. 30 (Lincoln Highway). Take a left and go 1-½ miles on Rt. 30 to Rainbow School. Take a left onto Country Club Road and follow it down to the reservoir. Take a left to the club.

Penn Oaks - at the intersection of Old Wilmington Pike and Route 202

The Springhaven Club - take Route 1 into Media, turn right on to N Providence Rd (Rt 252). Club is about 2.5 miles on left.

West Chester Country Club – Take Rt. 100 north out of West Chester. Club is on the left ¾ miles from town on West Ashbridge Street.

Whitford Country Club – From Exton Mall take Rt. 30 west. One mile west of Rt. 100 turn right at Sunoco station onto Whitford Road. Proceed one mile to Whitford Hill Road, turn left. Club is about ¾ mile on your left.
